

International Resource desired future state goals:

1. A significant number of countries use CAS materials/resources for basic and continuing education in general insurance.
2. The CAS has active relationships with established international organizations who look to the CAS for guidance and/or participation on general insurance issues.
3. CAS members routinely participate on general insurance research projects initiated by other organizations.
4. International actuaries routinely make use of research published by the CAS.
5. International actuaries attend CAS-sponsored meetings.
6. CAS members actively participate in international organizations (e.g. IAA, ASTIN, GIRO).
7. More international CAS members would be a sign of success but is not required to demonstrate success as a resource (this condition is sufficient but not necessary).
